Yet, the older I get, the more I feel a genuine appreciation for how clearly God allows us to see His grace and unchanging love toward us all in the life of Peter. The guy who receives revelation from the Father and boldly in front of everyone proclaims that Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah of God. Then moments later as Jesus makes known His fate to be arrested and die, Peter pulls the son of God aside and rebukes him! (Can you imagine having the guts to rebuke the guy you just acknowledged as the savior of the world?!)

Peter, who watches Jesus heal sick people, cast out demons, feed thousands with a couple fish and loaves, sees Him get transfigured before his eyes and have a chat with Moses & Elijah who have both been dead for hundreds of years... the day Jesus is arrested this guy

feels the need to pull a sword out and cut a mans ear off
in defense of the Prince Of Peace!

And of course we all remember Peter as the guy who so
confidently declared that even if everyone fall away and
abandoned Jesus, he would never do so... then we hear
that rooster crow three times...

Yet, this is also the guy to whom Jesus says in Matthew
16:18 *“And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will
