How Can I Get Guests To My Alpha?

When the initial surge of guests dies down after the first few Alpha courses, this is the question at the top of leaders' minds. All of us struggle with the idea of being rejected, the fear of hearing "no," and the possibility of awkwardness when we make an invitation of any kind. What if, instead of fearing the "no," we consider what could happen with a "yes" and choose to make the invite anyway? This resource offers a variety of invitational approaches we've curated to help you prepare to launch your Alpha.



Why?

Imagine a culture where your community is ready and looking for opportunities to listen, invite, and

extend radical hospitality to everyone around them. As you incorporate more of your ministry into the mission and vision of Alpha, more people will come to Alpha which means more people have the opportunity to encounter Jesus. This has a ripple effect on all aspects of your organization. When we see the movement of God in one area, we can't help but want to see that happen everywhere.

It all starts with a personal invitation.

What the Whole Church Can Do





Host an Alpha Sunday three to six weeks before launch.

*Dedicating time to an Alpha Sunday three to six weeks before you launch your Alpha helps communicate the "Why" of Alpha and highlights the difference between Alpha and a typical small group or Bible study experience.



of invitation and transformation from the front each week leading up to the launch of your Alpha to maintain momentum.



Highlight stories (live or video) to share what running Alpha has done in your church and community. Use this day to launch a time of prayer and fasting for your church attenders using pre-printed prayer cards. Pass out the invitational materials you downloaded or ordered in preparation for this day and encourage your church to think of three people they can pray about inviting to Alpha.

Successful Alphas are driven by volunteers, but often when they are championed from the front through something like an "Alpha Sunday," it's easier for the church attenders to capture the vision and be inspired to invite.

Sample Four-week Church Invitational Journey

Each week encourage everyone to pray for and invite three people to the next Alpha

First Sunday: Share an Alpha intro video/trailer.

Second Sunday: Share a guest story of someone whose life was changed on Alpha (live or video).

Third Sunday: Share a story of someone who invited a guest to Alpha (live or video).

Remind everyone it's not too late to to invite their three people to Alpha.



Action #2 Equip Your Church



Equip your church with prepared invitational materials.



People equipped with invitational materials—like pre-printed cards in a variety of sizes or digital images—may be more likely to extend an invitation to someone important to them. You can also order personalized invitations at a low cost through our partner, Outreach, Inc., at outreach.com/alpha.

Action #3 Taste of Alpha



Host a 'Taste of Alpha.'



Create an Alpha evening for your church attenders to experience it for themselves. Include as many of the components of a session as you can including hospitality, food, videos, small group tables, and conversation starters. This is a great time for your team to practice listening, hospitality, and reliance on the Holy Spirit as they host guests.

After experiencing an Alpha session of their own, they will better understand what an Alpha is like and how different it truly is from other small group experiences.

Take it one step further and offer a brief question and answer period at the end of the event and send everyone home with physical invitations to begin inviting guests.

But how do I invite?

An invitation can be as simple and casual as this: "I'm getting ready to do Alpha and thought of you! It's a time to gather, eat a good meal, watch a short video about life and faith, and then there's time to share what you think about the topic. All thoughts are welcome. If I picked you up or met you there, would you come check it out with me?"

What the Alpha Team Can Do

Action #1 Identify People





Help your team and entire church consider the question: "Who do you invite?"



First, identify some people—it all starts with us, the leaders in the church. If we don't invite, how do we expect others to do so?

Think through the hidden, marginalized, or new people are in your spheres.

Who is most likely to attend an Alpha?

A helpful tip is to think through people who have recently experienced transition:

- Geographical change
- Family situational change
- Financial shift/career change
- Grief
- Personal life challenges (sound like the last three years?)



Action #2 Share Your Story




Prompt your team to think through their stories asking the question: "How has God made a difference in your life?"



It may sound a little like: I used to be self-serving / people pleasing / in addiction / hopeless, but then I met God and now the fruit of the Spirit in my life looks like ____."

Then keep praying and watch for open doors to share your story!

Action #3 Pray with Intentionality



Lay a foundation of prayer using the Luke 11:02 initiative.





Before inviting guests to explore faith on Alpha, we pray about who we will invite—prayer precedes the invitation. Luke 11:02 teaches us to pray 'Your kingdom come.' At 11:02 a.m., each day for 21 days before the launch of your Alpha, invite the entire church to pray for their city and for three people they want to know Jesus.
